Many Happy Returns at the Tulsa PAC!

Tulsa, OK. Several fan favorites return for encores at the Tulsa Performing Arts Center in May!

Australian charmers **The Ten Tenors** are back for two new Mother's Day weekend performances, May 9-10. Presented by Celebrity Attractions, the group will perform an all-new show, featuring 20th-century classics such as "Moon River" and "As Time Goes By." Tickets are \$18-\$60.

Popular conductor Daniel Hege comes back to lead **Tulsa Symphony Orchestra** in a concert titled "**From Heroes to Eternity**" on May 16, featuring the music of Strauss, Verdi and Wagner. Tickets are \$5-\$60.

Comedian **Jerry Seinfeld** reprises earlier appearances with his latest rib-ticklers. There's one show only! This sold-out event takes place on May 28.

Also returning — or continuing — from April with two performances is Tulsa Opera's *L'Elisir d'Amore*. This sunny Donizetti comedy toasts love, friendship and laughter, and features outstanding performances. Tickets for the May 1 and May 3 performances are \$20-\$95.

On May 1 and 2, the American Theatre Company drama *A Picasso*, and *Tulsa Press Club's Gridiron Show* finish their runs. Tickets for *A Picasso* are \$24-\$35, with discounts available, and *Gridiron* tickets are \$20.

Tulsa School of Arts and Sciences presents its first-ever production at the PAC, the musical *Lucky Stiff*, on May 9-10. This is a zany, offbeat and very funny murder mystery farce based on *The Man Who Broke the Bank at Monte Carlo*. Tickets are \$15; \$10 for students.

Tulsa Town Hall patrons will fill Chapman Music Hall to hear author David Lampton explain "Chinese Power and What It Means to America" on May 15 (tickets by subscription), and as spring days grow longer, Theatre Tulsa takes us on a *Long Day's Journey Into Night*. Eugene O'Neill's Pulitzer Prize-winning play is a searing look back at the playwright's own family of origin. Theatre Tulsa tickets are \$20 for adults; \$15 for students and seniors.

Kids take over when Grace Ann Productions' Children's Theatre presents six performances of *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*. Based on Charles M. Schulz's popular *Peanuts* comic strip, the musical chronicles the events of a day in the life of lovable loser Charlie Brown and his imaginative beagle, Snoopy. The show runs May 1-10. Tickets are \$15, with discounts available. Also this month is an adult program from Grace Ann Productions, *Closer*. This is a brutal, honest and sometimes funny examination of modern romance and betrayal. The play runs May 22-30. Tickets are \$15; \$13 for students. Recommended for mature audiences.

Ending the month is a satire from Tulsa's newest acting troupe, the Odeum Theatre Company, performing David Mamet's 1988 Pulitzer Prize-winning *Speed the Plow*. This hilarious play, recommended for mature audiences, depicts a culture as corrupt as the society it claims to reflect. Play dates are May 28-May 31. Tickets are \$15; \$10 for seniors, students and groups of more than 10.

In the Gallery this month is the work of **Diane Salamon**. She is a nationally recognized painter whose work is a visual journey with musical undertones that cause the viewer to drift or dance through each painting. Admission to the Gallery is free and open to the public.
